Dear Parishioners,

It's a bittersweet time for our church as we mourn the loss of our Holy Father, Pope John Paul II. It is bitter because our loss is felt deeply by Catholics and non-Catholics alike. Television news coverage demonstrates this on a scale beyond compare. Yet, it is sweet because this great and holy man is now celebrating eternal life.

Born on May 18, 1920, Karol Wojtyla grew up in a modest family. His mother died when he was only 9 years old and his father died when Karol was 22 years of age. This young man knew suffering. When the Germans occupied Poland in 1939, his university was closed and he was forced to study underground. In 1942, after his father's death and after recovering from two near-fatal accidents, Karol Wojtyla felt the call to the priesthood. Obviously, God had a plan for him, but little did he know where this calling would lead him.

He was ordained to the priesthood on November 1, 1946. On July 4, 1958, while on a canoeing vacation with students, Father Wojtyla was named an Auxiliary Bishop in Krakow. On December 30, 1963, Pope Paul VI named Bishop Wojtyla Archbishop of Krakow, and a Cardinal on June 26, 1967. During the conclave of October 1978, this Holy and outstanding Cardinal was elected Pope at the relatively youthful age of fifty-eight by an overwhelming majority of the cardinals (103 out of 109 votes).

Immediately after being elected Roman Pontiff, John Paul II addressed the Cardinals. He pledged himself unreservedly to promoting with prudent but encouraging action, the exact fulfillment of the Second Vatican Council. The next day he told his colleagues that he saw his role as witnessing to universal love. And now some twenty-seven years later, we are witnessing the return of that love by people of every race, color and creed.

O Lord, our God,
thank you for blessing your church on earth
with an extraordinary shepherd.

This great and holy servant,
fulfilled the mission you gave him.
May the fruit of his labors
nourish our spiritual gardens
for generations to come.

Rest in peace dear Holy Father.

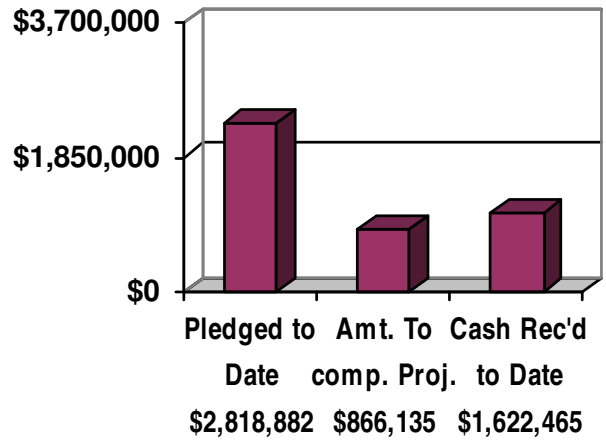

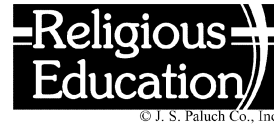

Respect Life News: The 1973 Supreme Court decision, Roe v. Wade, was the event that legalized abortion in the United States. Besides permitting the destruction of innocent life, this decision can also be used as a test case for senators when they are making decisions about confirming judicial nominees for work in our federal court system. In short, if a nominee doesn't support Roe v. Wade (and a pro-choice agenda) he or she would not be confirmed for the job. It is for this reason that the National Committee for a Human Life Amendment and the Secretariat for Pro-life Activities, of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, are sponsoring a Postcard Signing focusing on the U.S. Senate. The purpose of the Postcards is to encourage our Senators, not to require support of Roe v. Wade in determining a nominee's fitness for judicial office.

The postcards are available at the doors of the church. All parishioners are encouraged to take a postcard home with you, fill it out and mail it with proper postage. It is in making our voices heard that our system of government can work on behalf of the dignity of all human life.

And as always pray for the protection of innocent, and for all who are affected by abortion.
