# From the Pastor

St. Agnes Church, Inc.

Dear Parishioners,

A little over a year ago, I announced the possibility of entering into a partnership with Catholic Cemeteries of the Archdiocese to develop St. Agnes Cemetery here on church grounds. Many parishioners have been asking me about the status of the project. The feasibility study is now concluded. Unfortunately, it would not be in the best interest of either party.

Andrew Schaffer, Executive Director of Catholic Cemeteries, did a splendid job of surveying the property, securing a favorable ruling from the Department of Environment Protection Agency, and preparing the preliminary plans for submission to the Township. The fly in the ointment came when all residences around the reservoir received formal notification stating that these grounds may be subject to "C1" reclassification – pertaining to the 100-year flood regulations. What does this mean? It's the difference of developing 50 feet back from the water or 300 feet. This is a big difference!

Now "*possible*" reclassification does not mean that it is guaranteed. However, it will take numerous years to develop a cemetery and the uncertainty is too high of a risk. Developing a cemetery 300 feet back from the water would drastically reduce the amount of required land and it would not meet "*best usage*" standards. I know this news is disappointing to many parishioners, but in all of our planning and building, our motto has always been - *God's will be done*. I am now working with parish leadership in exploring other possibilities for best usage options. Please keep us in your prayers.

As you may know, Catholic Cemeteries has graciously extended to St. Agnes Church a loan for our phase I financing. Our agreement secured interest free funds as long as we were proceeding forward with cemetery development. Now that our partnership is terminated, St. Agnes agreed to pay 5.25% interest on the balance of funds owed. These are the terms of our agreement with Catholic Cemeteries, and I am grateful for their generosity and graciousness.

We are now well over three years into our capital campaign, and we are trying to redeem outstanding pledges. I would like to ask parishioners with pledge balances if you could possibly fulfill your obligation in the foreseeable near future? In the event that someone's financial situation has changed, please contact me and I will adjust your pledge accordingly. Thank you to everyone who worked so hard and sacrificed so much to make Phase I a reality. God Bless you all!

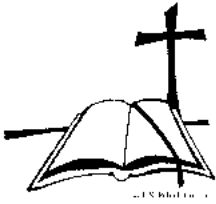
***New Energies Parish Transition Project***

**Archdiocese of Newark – 2007 Lenten Regulations**

The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

† On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted. Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast.

† On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.

The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence "substantially", or as a whole, is a serious obligation. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.

The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty\*) extends from the **First Sunday of Lent, February 25, 2007, to the**

**Solemnity of the Holy Trinity, June 31, 2007.** \* Canon 920, §1.

**DO NO HARM**

We listen quite a while before we get to the “punch line” of the first reading today: even though it would be an easy thing to do, David will not harm the anointed one of the Lord. We, of course, know that Jesus is the Messiah, the anointed one of God, but the Bible uses this term for many different people. It is scripture’s way of indicating who has been chosen by God for a special place and mission in salvation history.

In today’s Gospel, Jesus presents a greatly enlarged list of those who, as children of God, we should not harm, but love instead: our enemies, those who curse us or do us harm, those who owe us money, the ungrateful, the wicked. The point of Jesus’ teaching is not to encourage these kinds of behaviors in others, but rather to form us in the image of our heavenly Father by increasing our opportunities to love unconditionally, expecting no return; to be merciful and forgiving, even when it would be easier not to.
